Note: There was also a John Campbell on the Countess of Harcourt in 1821 and great care needs to be taken in interpreting the records to distinguish between the two men. The following information has not been entered above or used in the analysis of colonial offences because, circumstantially, it probably refers to John Campbell, Countess of Harcourt 1821.

Sydney 18 August 1828. SR, CSLS to the Sheriff 1828-1830, 4/3896 p16 [reel 1062]. John Campbell, Countess of Harcourt, arrived from Port Macquarie, to be sent to Hyde Park Barracks for disposal.

Sydney 6 October 1828. SR, CSLS to the Sheriff 1828-1830, 4/3896 p28 [reel 1062]. John Campbell, Countess of Harcourt, on a list of men on the hulk to be immediately forwarded to Hyde Park Barracks.
