SG 26 Nov 1827 4c (repeated 3 Dec 1827 3f). On list on convicts who had absconded "Hassett John, Earl St. Vincent, Ploughman, 30, County Cork, 5 feet 4, grey eyes, brown hair, fresh comp. From J. P. Webber Esq. J.P. Patterson's Plains". Note: He absconded with John Hanley who was on the same ship and also at Tocal.

SR. Sydney Gaol Entrance Book 1825-1828, 4/6429 [reel 850]. Admitted to Sydney Gaol 15 November 1827, committed from General Sessions, Sutton Forest, runaway from Hunter's River, to be returned.
