Other (source, details)

21 January 1831 (SR Returns of Trials, Newcastle Bench of Magistrates, COD 120). Henry Erwin, *Andromeda*, 7 years, in service of JP Webber, found in Newcastle without a pass, 36 lashes to be inflicted at three different times.

The following entries in the *Maitland Mercury* refer to Henry Irwin and his wife Mary. No ship is specified so exact identity is not confirmed:

- 10 March 1849. Henry and Mary Irwin brought before the Maitland Bench for stealing a watch, remanded for further evidence
- 11 March 1849, details of the watch theft given, both committed for trial
- 10 April 1849, both found guilty at Maitland Quarter Sessions and remanded for sentencing
- 14 April 1849, Mary Irwin 3 months Maitland Gaol with hard labour, Henry 6 months Maitland Gaol with hard labour.
