SR. Sydney Gaol Entrance Book 1829-1830, 4/6431 [reel 851]. Admitted 5 August 1829 from General Sessions, Patricks Plains for insolence and threats to his master. Iron gang 6 calendar months. Disposed 18 August to Parramatta.
