SR, Maitland Court of Quarter Sessions Papers 1835, 4/8414 p131 [reel 2408]. Free man, John Kipling, now employed as a fencer between James Phillips and Mr Wilson's farm [Tocal boundary] at Paterson charged with stealing two mawl rings on 13 May 1835, the property of James Phillips. Guilty.
