NSW GG 3 June 1835 p394. Between October and December 1834 transferred from JP Webber to C&F Wilson [transferred convicts were listed by occupation rather than surname, enabling identification of some individuals. Lane can be identified as the only 'clothier' among the Tocal convicts].

February 1836. (NSW GG 17 February 1836 p151). Lane James, Lord Lyndock, 33-2146, Somersetshire, clothier, absconded from C&T Wilson, Tocal, Paterson's River since February 9.

March 1836. (NSW GG 23 March 1836 p269). Lane James, apprehended, runaway from CF Wilson, Paterson.
