27 July 1830 made deposition regarding the burglary of Bona Vista. For details see data sheet for John Shepherd, *Ocean*. In this deposition, Levet (sic) is described as overseer to JP Webber esq. SR, Clerk of Peace, depositions, T148 No.38 31/9.

7 January 1831 John Levitt, *Bus Merch't* 1828...admitted to the Phoenix Hulk from Hyde Park Barracks 1 January 1831 to give evidence in criminal proceedings Styles & others, returned 5 January 1831, behaviour in hulk "tolerable". SR Phoenix Hulk Entrance Book 1831-33, #47, 4/6282 [reel 819]. Similar entry in separate volume, reason given as "King versus Styles & others". SR Phoenix Hulk Entrance Book 1825-1831, #3405, 4/6281 [reel 819].
