Restored No. 42/711 42/711 Paterson, 28 February 1842, 4/4160 [reel 943]. In lieu of 40/1669 dated 1 August 1840. On recommendation of Royal Engr 12 February 1842. Restored on a minute by the Govr dated 19 February 1842 on a letter from Capt Marsh ass't Eng'r dated 12 February 1842 reg'd no 42/1828.
