Logan can be identified as the only 'brushmaker' among the Tocal convicts].</p> <p>26 August 1837. SR. Punishment Book ("Black Book"), Patricks Plains 1833-39, 7/3714, p124 [reel 689]. Logan James, Buss Mercht 28, 14 years, employed by Mr W Blaxland, drunk, 50 lashes.</p>
