His mother was convicted and transported for the same offence. See SR, Bound Indents 4/4014 page 199 [fiche 672]. Millson, Catherine, arrived Sydney 3 August 1829 on the *Sovereign*, age 44, a dairywomen from Yorkshire, convicted of stealing geese, tried Northallerton 14 January 1829, sentenced to 7 years, "*Son expected as Edward Millson already convicted*".

See also Calendar of Prisoners, Northallerton Quarter Sessions 12 January 1829, North Yorkshire Record Office, Miscellaneous Collections, Australian Joint Copying Project, reel M2112. Catherine Millson (aged 43) and Edward Millsom (aged 19) committed 2 December 1828, charged with having feloniously stolen, taken and carried away, nineteen geese, of the value of four pounds ten shillings, the property of Christopher Smith. Guilty, to be each transported for seven years.

NSWGG 1840 p54. Police Office Paterson 14 January 1840, Notice, Edward Milsom, breach of the Licensing Act, list of property to be sold at public auction, includes empty keg and a keg containing six gallons of rum.
