16 June 1832 (CSIL 32/4577 in 4/2145). Sydney, from HC Sempill, Sedgenhoe. Rowan, Charles (Mermaid, 1830) one of 20 men lent to him, to be returned to the Road Party. Requested he be assigned to Mr Macqueen because "very weakly state and unfit for a road party". He was assigned to John (?) Webber of Pattersons River "but turned into Government by that Gentleman on account of his weakly constitution". [request refused].
