Restored Vide 43/1664. 43/1664 Moreton Bay 30 June 1843 on recommendation of the Moreton Bay Bench, 4/4178 [reel 949]. In lieu of 40/1765 cancelled. Per the Gov Minute on a Petition by Slowey per 43/6755.

<p>SR Newcastle Gaol Entrance Book 1829-33, 2/2004 [reel 755]. Admitted from Patersons Plains 18 January 1832 for seven days solitary confinement. Disposed to the Bench (Paterson?) for further disposal 3 February 1832.</p> <p>SR Invermein Bench Book 1836-37, 4/7553 [reel 678]. 10 February 1837, Patrick Sloey, Mangles 1828 life [assigned to] Col Dumaresq. Prisoner brought in his flock of lambs 30 short, search found 25 alive and two or three killed by dogs, two unaccounted for. "The Bench in consequence of the heretofore good character of the Prisoner, He having been 9 years without punishment direct his Ticket of Leave to be suspended six Months." [He was not holding a Ticket at this time, so this presumably means the minimum term before eligibility to apply was extended by six months].</p>
