Other (source, details)

NSW GG 25 June 1834 p439. One of three farming men transferred from JP Webber to Capt Clarke. [This followed the sale of Webber's Munnmurra Station at Cassilis to Clarke. Talty is not mentioned in the GG by name, but has been identified by datamatching].

SR, Newcastle Gaol Entrance Book, 2/2005 [reel 756]. Several entries for Patrick or Peter Falty or Talty, Jane 1831, from Clare, Catholic, labourer (there is no Falty on the Jane, only Peter Talty). Admitted to the Gaol 5 November 1834 from Maitland Quarter Sessions, remanded to next session, disposed to Maitland for trial 21 January 1835. Readmitted to Newcastle Gaol on remand (as Patrick Talty), and tried May 1835. [Note: depositions for his case were taken in April 1834 for the incident which occurred in January 1834 so he was probably on remand for 16 months].

SR, Maitland Quarter Sessions, 4/8413 p291 [reel 2408]. Peter Talty, Jane 1831, life, assigned to James Webber, charged with robbing his Master's store at Munnmurra Station on 22 January 1834 and having property in his possession that he could not account for – shoes, frock, trousers etc, the goods and chattels of James Webber esq. Depositions were taken in April 1834 by magistrates William Dumaresq and HC Semphill [Cassilis Bench?] from the following:

- James Clarke of Peele River (by time of trial, overseer to Mr EG Cory at Liverpool Plains)
- William Clewley, assigned servant to James Webber (by time of trial, transferred to Captain Clarke)
- Patrick Healy, assigned servant to James Webber (by time of trial, transferred to Captain Clarke).

Following the depositions, Talty was committed for trial, and finally tried in August 1835. The following witnesses were required by the prisoner: John Beck (TOL Cassilis), Roger Dobson (TOL at the Old Banks), Samuel Doyle (prisoner assigned to Richard Stone employed near Cassilis).

Note: the outcome of the trial is not recorded in this record, but he had already served 16 months in gaol on remand. With the QS session papers is a letter dated 4 March 1835 from John Kinchela, Attorney-General's Office to Fred'k Garling Esq [Crown Prosecutor, Courts of Quarter Sessions]. Kinchela informs Garling he has received a letter from Pat'k Talty from Maitland saying he had been confined for three sessions. Kinchela requested an account of Talty's situation.
