<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>John Tiernan committed to Newcastle Gaol 2 January 1827, remained there until 9 March 1827 when sent to work in the mines</li> <li>On personal application of Mr Cory, to whom he was an assigned servant, restored to Mr Cory about 20 April</li> </ul>
