Colonial Secretary's correspondence

22 July 1835, Paterson Bench, assigned to C&F Wilson, 50 lashes for absconding, 50 lashes for neglect of work (SR. Colonial Trials and Records, Benches of Magistrates 1832-36, X708, reel 662). He was working at Tocal in April 1837 when he made a deposition re the killing of Costigan by Lyons – for a transcript, see the datasheet for Bernard Lyons.

<p>NSW GG <i>15 July 1835</i> p488. Woolard William, Mangles, 17, London, tailor's boy... absconded from F & C Wilson, Patersons River, since July 6 [note Elija Corrigan absconded at the same time].</p> <p>MM 19 April 1845, 4.1: Entered the ploughing competition at Maitland show as a bullock driver, part of the Tocal team.</p> <p>On 8 August 1846 he died of a heart attack while digging stumps on Tocal for Charles Reynolds (MM 15 August 1846 p2.4).</p> <p>He was buried at St Paul's Paterson on 10 August 1846.</p>
