Cancelled 8 September 1849 for Drunkenness and disorderly conduct. And when restored to be issued for another and a distant district. Gov memo dated 12 Sep 1849. PP 47/478." 50/26 Queanbeyan 28 January 1850, 4/4222 [reel 964]. Altered to Maitland 3 June 1852. TOL passport 47/478 20 July 1847, 4/4266 [reel 976]. Allowed to proceed to New England in the service of Messrs Jamison and McKenzie for 3 months, on recommendation of the Maitland Bench.

1848	Received permission to marry Johanna Walsh at Morpeth
1849 Sep	TOL cancelled for drunkenness and disorderly conduct
1850 Jan	TOL restored for Queanbeyan
1852 June	TOL altered to Maitland

NSW GG **12 February 1841** p246. Wootton Charles, John Barry (4), 22, Worcester, farm laborer ... absconded from Felix Wilson, Paterson, since 28th January.
 MM **16 March 1844**, in ploughing match in the team of Charles Reynolds (lessee of Tocal)
 MM **19 April 1845**, 4.1: Entered the ploughing competition at Maitland show as a bullock driver, part of the Tocal team.
27 October 1849 Chas Wotton, J Barry 1838 (sic), Worcestershire, Protestant, labourer, admitted to Sydney Gaol, #1320, from Police for Cockatoo Island. Disposed to Cockatoo Island 3 November 1849. SR, Sydney and Darlinghurst Gaol Entrance Books, 4/6441 [reel 854].
